

**GAMBLE TOWNSHIP BOARD OF SUPERVISORS  
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES – MAY 20, 2024**

The Gamble Township Board of Supervisors held their regular monthly meeting at the Gamble Township Community Hall, Trout Run, PA. Present were Supervisors Joseph Reighard, Stephen Brady, David Bailey, Roadmaster Justin McCoy and Secretary Raine Ohnmeiss.

The meeting was called to order by Joseph Reighard at 7:30 p.m. followed by the Pledge of Allegiance.

**MINUTES**

A motion was made by David Bailey, seconded by Joseph Reighard and unanimously passed approving the regular meeting minutes of April 15, 2024, with the correction that the AED is being offered by UPMC not the County.

**FINANCIAL**

A motion was made by David Bailey, seconded by Joseph Reighard and unanimously passed approving the bills list of May 20, 2024, and bills to be paid.

A motion was made by David Bailey, seconded by Joseph Reighard and unanimously passed approving the treasurer's report for the period ending April 30, 2024.

The Board reviewed the receipts list for April 2024.

**REPORTS**

ZONING OFFICER/PLANNING/EMA COORDINATOR – No reports submitted.

ROADMASTER – Joseph Reighard provided the Road Tour Report, which should be used as a work task list for the road crew. David Bailey would like Winner Lane by Pat Hipple's added to the list due to the road washing away. Justin McCoy stated there are issues with the credit card being declined, Raine Ohnmeiss will contact Elan Financial. A tax-exempt form is needed for Lowe's, it was requested tax-exempt forms be completed and placed in township vehicles for when they may be needed. Pipe flushing was discussed, McCoy is unsure if the fire company is willing to provide their services. Loyalsock Township, S. Williamsport Borough and Glenn O. Hawbaker should be contacted to check availability for pipe flushing. The mower broke down, repairs have been made and it is up and running. Pipe work will begin on Mill Creek, ditches will be cleaned, road graded, rolled and subbase placed. Wilson Hill will be mowed 5/21/24. Joseph Reighard will look for commercial sprayers to complete roadside spraying. A discussion was held regarding the updating of trucks. Financially the township can get into a 5-year rotation. Vendors that sell the 600 series or similar will be researched on Co-stars. Discussion of purchasing a snowplow for the tractor was discussed. Maintenance of the trucks after snowstorms were also discussed. The township will hold off on tar and chip until next year. McCoy will contact Barry at PennDOT for FDR only on Lake Road, next year the township will look at paving it. The graffiti remover that was purchased removes everything, color, etc. All signs that were ordered have been installed.

**OLD BUSINESS**

Trout Run Fire Company – Letter was sent. Remove from old business.

**OLD BUSINESS (continued)**

Starklink – There is no longer a waiting list. Joseph Reighard asked Stephen Bailey if there will be the possibility of fiber optic service, if so, should we wait. Bailey stated a feasibility study is required, so the township should move forward with Starlink.

ARPA Funds – ARPA Funds need to be spent by December 2026. The funds are being earmarked for the Community Hall Renovation. Joseph Reighard will schedule a meeting with a contractor/architect to look at the building.

CPF Facilities – Remove from old business.

AED – The township just needs to find a location for the apparatus. Remove from old business.

**NEW BUSINESS/ACTION ITEMS**

One bid was received for Anti-skid. Heidelberg Materials Northeast, LLC bid is as follows: FOB Plant \$19.50/ton, Delivered to Twp. Bldg. \$31.50/ton and as directed \$32.50/ton. A motion was made by David Bailey, seconded by Stephen Brady and unanimously passed awarding the Anti-skid Bid to Heidelberg Materials Northeast, LLC.

The Board discussed the Act 13 Certificate of Deposit which matures 7/15/24. Rates for money market checking will be obtained.

**PUBLIC COMMENT**

Sandy Baylor asked how the payroll sheets were going to be provided to the Secretary. The original sheets will be placed in the mailbox for pickup by the Secretary.

David Bailey stated the fatal vehicle accident on Sugar Camp was due to a medical situation.

Joseph Reighard asked that we keep his mother-in-law in our prayers as she is not doing well.

There being no further questions or comments, a motion was made by Joseph Reighard, seconded by Stephen Bailey and unanimously approved to adjourn the meeting at 8:29 p.m.
